What Is Build San Francisco:

Build San Francisco is an exciting opportunity for students to collaborate with professionals in the field of urban design - the architects, contractors, builders, and government officials responsible for creating the urban landscape. Build San Francisco allows students to work with mentors who are actively involved in the construction of a major San Francisco project. Past participants have been involved with the creation of such major San Francisco landmarks as the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art and Pac Bell Park.

What's involved:

Students and mentors are paired together based on mutual interests. Students meet regularly each week with their mentor to learn the many aspects of the design process. In addition, they meet once a week from 4:00-7:00 p.m. with a team of instructors to develop a common project with the other Build San Francisco students. These meetings are after school, at a location convenient to public transportation. Students receive academic units based upon their hours of service. At the end of twelve weeks, students who successfully complete the project receive a \$500.00 scholarship from the Architectural Foundation of San Francisco.

How Do I Enroll:

Enrollment is through the San Francisco Unified School District Regional Occupation Program (R.O.P.). Talk to your school career counselor to help you with enrollment. Or you can enroll yourself by calling R.O.P at 415/242-2600 and asking for enrollment information for Build San Francisco. Either of these methods will work.
