

Cal Poly Architecture Summer Career Workshop for High School Students

The Architecture Department offers an intensive 4-week workshop designed for high school students considering architecture as a career or developing a design portfolio. Students are presented an in-depth view of the career through hands-on experience in studio design exercises, lectures, projects, and field trips. Activities cover architectural design and history, computer applications, building science, structural engineering, and site planning. Studios and lectures are taught by senior faculty of the College of Architecture and Environmental Design.

Students are assigned workstations in upper division design studios and use facilities in the largest school of its kind in the nation. Cal Poly's Architecture Department, which offers a fully accredited Bachelor of Architecture degree, is proud of its national reputation and is committed to "hands-on" education.

The workshop will help students develop decision-making confidence related to difficult university career options. As the cost of education escalates at state private institutions, it becomes increasingly important for students to make informed decisions regarding university studies. Individual career and college counseling for each student is an integral part of the program.

Participating students will live in residence halls where they become familiar with the dynamics of campus life. Responsibility and social skills develop as long term friendships emerge.

The cost of the month-long program includes lodging, meals, field trips, and most workshop materials.
